Dialectical Journal Entries

You will be keeping a dialectical journal for your selected novel. You will write TWENTY dialectical journal entries. As you read, stop periodically to reflect on and analyze the reading. Write down a quotation/passage from the novel. Then write an explanation or analysis of the passage. There is no required length for the responses, but the responses should be *thoughtful and meaningful*. The responses should include analysis of various elements of the novel. These elements could include conflict development, character development, setting, themes, and the writer's style (this includes point of view, diction, tone, and syntax). Your entries must address quotations/passages from *throughout* the novel. **Please type your entries.**

The purpose of this activity is to develop your skills in critical thinking and reflecting. Therefore, avoid entries that seem to simply summarize the quotations. Use parenthetical citations (author's name and page number) in MLA format for each of the quotations.
